The Feast of Christ the King ends our Liturgical Year. Jesus is a king, but He is not interested in earthly power. The leader of

all people, the King of love and peace, He has come to teach us to know and live God's will.

<u>Family Activity</u>: Honor Christ's kingship at home by placing a white pillar candle in the center of your kitchen or dining-room table to be lighted at mealtimes. This symbol of the "light of Christ" will help guide your family through the Church year and light up the holiday seasons of Advent and Christmas as well.

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent. Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (meaning, "ad-venio in Latin or "to come to") is the season leading up to the celebration of Christmas. The Advent season



is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and also to the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. Advent devotions remind us of the *meaning* of the season. These include the lighting of the Advent wreath; the Advent calendar which helps remind us of the season with daily thoughts and activities; the Advent prayers that prepare us spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ. It is important to make time to prepare our hearts and minds for Jesus' coming and to remind us of the true meaning of Christmas. *What special preparations will your family make this Advent season?*

<u>Daniel 7: 13-14; Psalm 93; Revelation 1: 5-8; John 18: 33b-37</u>

#### From today's Gospel reading:

Pilate said to Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?"...Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world."

Reflection:

Jesus' kingdom, His world, is with us now. We have, through our baptism and the gift of the Spirit, been given the vision to see the presence of the kingdom and its life-giving possibilities. It is a world of community, equality, respect, and dialogue. In the kingdom, under Jesus' rule, each person's gifts are recognized. The poor and neglected are empowered and no one is left out. Justice is given to each, regardless of their political influence, race, gender, or economic status.

#### So we ask ourselves:

- Who or what set of values rule my life and guide my daily decisions?
- What can I do to respond more fully to Jesus' rule in my life.




This *morning* faith sharing group meets **twice** a month, on Thursday mornings from 10:00-11:30AM in the Parish Conference Room. We are currently reading

#### Do you know?

The Christmas Novena is a prayer prayed 15 times every day from the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle (November 30<sup>th</sup>) until Christmas. The novena is not actually addressed to Saint Andrew but to God Himself, asking Him to grant our request in the honor of the birth of His Son at Christmas. You can say the prayer 15 times all at once, or divide up the recitation as necessary (perhaps five times at each meal).

The Christmas Novena Prayer

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold.

In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ and of His Blessed Mother. Amen
